King filed House Bill 3387 to restrict the First Amendment rights by removing protections from ordinary activists who criticize the actions of elected officials by making lawsuits easier for elected officials. Another bill, House Bill 3388, would have removed ordinary qualified privileges for journalists who exercise their First Amendment rights by supporting candidates or issues. During the special session, he voted for a weakening amendment to the Pro-Life Health Insurance Reform bill. Also, when Representative Schaefer offered an amendment to protect preborn children with disabilities from painful abortions after 20 weeks, King opposed the life-saving amendment. King is one of Texas Right to Life's 2017 Disappointments.
