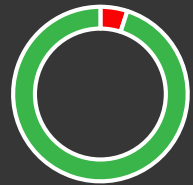

| ✓ Amendment 3 by Turner                                       | Weakens the dismemberment abortion ban with an exception to dismember unborn children conceived through sexual assault or incest. (Opposed by Texas Right to Life.)   | 3             | 3                |
| ✓ Amendment 4 by Farrar                                       | Weakens the dismemberment abortion ban if the abortionist claims that dismemberment was safer. (Opposed by Texas Right to Life.)  | 3             | 3                |
| ✗ Amendment 5 by Farrar                                       | Weakens the dismemberment abortion ban by adding vague terms to the "life of the mother" exception already in the bill. (Opposed by Texas Right to Life.)   | 0 (UA)        | 3                |

This motion to table was to kill Schaefer's amendment, demarcating loyalty to the Pro-Life cause or the anti-Life leadership of the Texas House. (Motion to Table Opposed by Texas Right to Life.) | 6             | 6                |
