During the regular session, Senator Hancock authored Senate Bill 1427, a bill that would have closed the loophole that allows for discriminatory abortions of preborn children with disabilities after 20 weeks. Regrettably, this bill did not move. Additionally, Senator Hancock used his role as chairman of the Senate Committee on Business and Commerce to swiftly move multiple versions of the Pro-Life Health Insurance Reform policy through that committee.
