Senator Creighton authored Senate Bill 2129, a comprehensive reform of the Texas Advance Directives Act to protect patients from violations of their right to Life and due process. Current law allows basic life-sustaining treatment (like a ventilator) to be withdrawn from patients against their will after the hospital committee gives the patient a 10-day notice. Texas has more to offer vulnerable patients than imposed death or involuntary euthanasia, and Senator Creighton's bill presented a Pro-Life, just solution for vulnerable patients receiving life-sustaining treatment. Unfortunately, SB 2129 did not pass, but a related Pro-Life bill did pass out of the Senate with the help of Senator Creighton.

#### Senate Bill 23 by Senator Lois Kolkhorst (R-Brenham): The Born-Alive Infant Protection Act

Ensures medical intervention and legal protection for children born alive after an attempted abortion.
