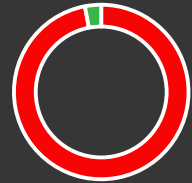

Whitmire voted against guaranteeing basic protections and medical care for children who survive an attempted abortion. By this vote, Whitmire favored infanticide.

Whitmire voted for amendments clearly intended to weaken or undermine Pro-Life Senate Bill 22, which prohibited cities and counties from using local tax dollars to benefit the abortion industry. By voting against this Pro-Life priority bill, Whitmire publicly supported allowing cities and counties to continue using Texans' tax dollars to benefit the abortion industry.

Furthermore, Whitmire voted against prohibiting the remaining late-term abortions in Texas and opposed prohibiting discriminatory abortions. By this vote, Whitmire publicly endorsed deadly discrimination in the womb and late-term abortions.

Finally, Whitmire voted against reforming the current rule that allows basic life-sustaining treatment (like a ventilator) to be withdrawn from patients against their will after the hospital committee gives the patient a 10-day notice. Texas has more to offer vulnerable patients than imposed death or involuntary euthanasia.

**Senate Bill 23 by Senator Lois Kolkhorst (R-Brenham):  
 The Born-Alive Infant Protection Act**

Ensures medical intervention and legal protection for children born alive after an attempted abortion.

*Senate Bill 23 passed the Senate but the House version of the bill, House Bill 16, ultimately became law.*

## Senate Bill 1033 by Senator Kelly Hancock (R-North Richland Hills): The Preborn NonDiscrimination Act (PreNDA)

Prohibits the remaining late-term and discriminatory abortions in Texas. Also requires physicians to provide lists of medical and social resources to parents at the time of a diagnosis of disability for their preborn child.

*Senate Bill 1033 passed the Senate but died in the House.*
